Colour the picture, then point to one feature that helps you talk about story characters.



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Parent & Teacher Guidance

Curriculum focus

Topic: Story characters. Develop accurate observation, subject vocabulary and evidence-based explanation. Mapped scope: EYFS learning and development: purposeful play, communication, physical development and expressive learning.

Before you begin

Review the picture together and ask the learner what they already notice about Story characters. Read the activity aloud, explain unfamiliar vocabulary, and agree which details need special attention.

Solo activity

The learner can complete the colouring independently, then use the finished page to explain three details linked to Story characters. Encourage accurate colour choices where they carry meaning, but allow creative choices elsewhere.

Group activity

Give pairs or small groups different areas to inspect. Ask them to agree on evidence before colouring, compare their findings, and present one curriculum fact to the class. Finish with a whole-group check against the guidance below.

Questions to guide discussion

What evidence can you see? Which feature is most important and why? How does one part connect to another? What new fact about Story characters can you explain using the picture?

Answers and checking

Open response. Accept one clearly visible, relevant feature and the learner's spoken description. Useful adult vocabulary: story characters, feature, evidence, function, process.
