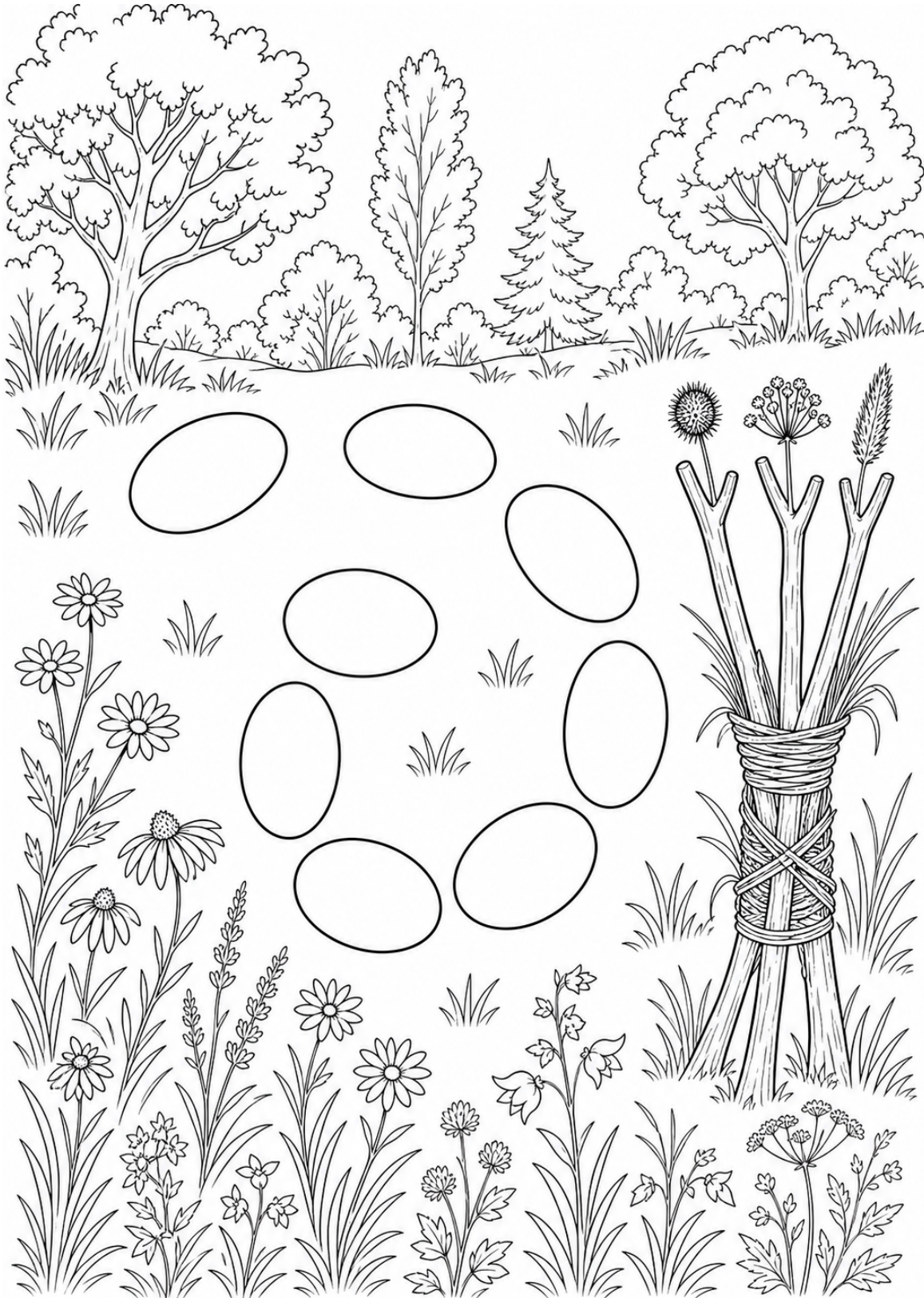


Natural sculpture Vocabulary And Facts Colouring Page

KS1 / Year 2 - Art And Design

Find and count the eight smooth stones in the spiral sculpture, then colour the natural materials using repeated patterns.



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Parent & Teacher Guidance

Curriculum focus

Topic: Natural sculpture. Develop accurate observation, subject vocabulary and evidence-based explanation. Mapped scope: KS1 Art and Design: using sculpture to develop ideas and developing techniques in shape, form, pattern and texture..

Before you begin

Review the picture together and ask the learner what they already notice about Natural sculpture. Read the activity aloud, explain unfamiliar vocabulary, and agree which details need special attention.

Solo activity

The learner can complete the colouring independently, then use the finished page to explain three details linked to Natural sculpture. Encourage accurate colour choices where they carry meaning, but allow creative choices elsewhere.

Group activity

Give pairs or small groups different areas to inspect. Ask them to agree on evidence before colouring, compare their findings, and present one curriculum fact to the class. Finish with a whole-group check against the guidance below.

Questions to guide discussion

What evidence can you see? Which feature is most important and why? How does one part connect to another? What new fact about Natural sculpture can you explain using the picture?

Answers and checking

The spiral sculpture contains exactly 8 smooth stones. The separate sculpture also uses twigs, seed heads and woven grasses; these are natural materials but are not included in the stone count.
