

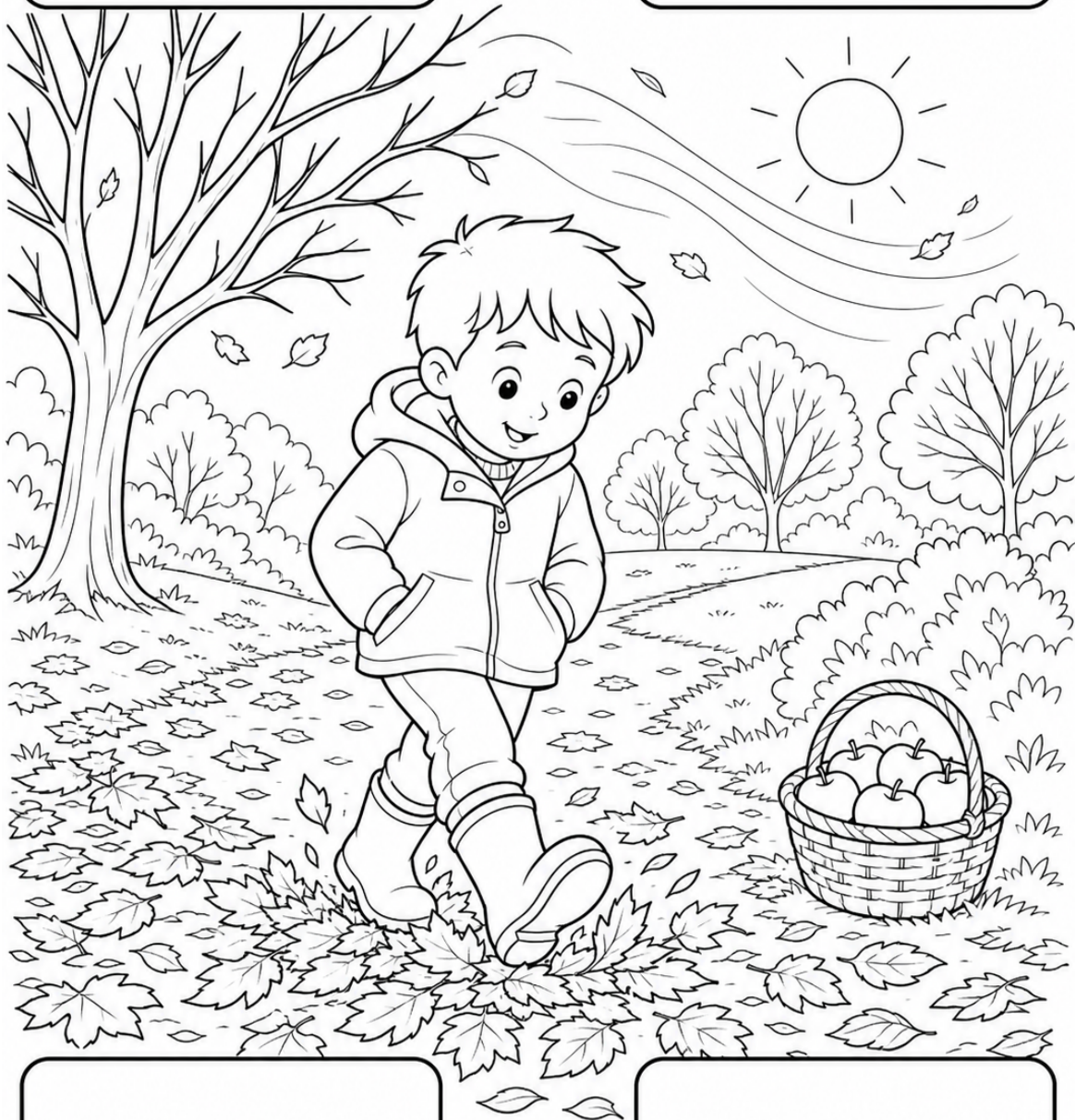
Poetry imagery Activity Challenge Colouring Page

KS1 / Year 2 - English

Read four autumn phrase cards and match each one to its picture clue: leaves, wind, sun and apples.

leaves crunch

wind whispers



sun glows

apples smell sweet

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Parent & Teacher Guidance

Curriculum focus

Topic: Poetry imagery. Develop accurate observation, subject vocabulary and evidence-based explanation. Mapped scope: Year 2 English: listening to, discussing and expressing views about poetry, discussing favourite words and phrases, and building a repertoire of poems..

Before you begin

Review the picture together and ask the learner what they already notice about Poetry imagery. Read the activity aloud, explain unfamiliar vocabulary, and agree which details need special attention.

Solo activity

The learner can complete the colouring independently, then use the finished page to explain three details linked to Poetry imagery. Encourage accurate colour choices where they carry meaning, but allow creative choices elsewhere.

Group activity

Give pairs or small groups different areas to inspect. Ask them to agree on evidence before colouring, compare their findings, and present one curriculum fact to the class. Finish with a whole-group check against the guidance below.

Questions to guide discussion

What evidence can you see? Which feature is most important and why? How does one part connect to another? What new fact about Poetry imagery can you explain using the picture?

Answers and checking

The matches are 'leaves crunch'-dry leaves under the child's boots; 'wind whispers'-curved wind lines through the branches; 'sun glows'-the low autumn sun; and 'apples smell sweet'-the basket of apples. Invite children to explain which sense each phrase suggests.
