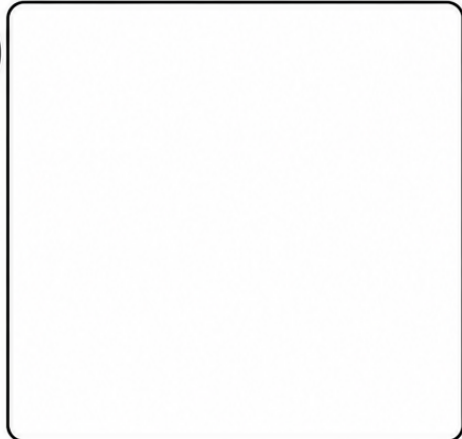
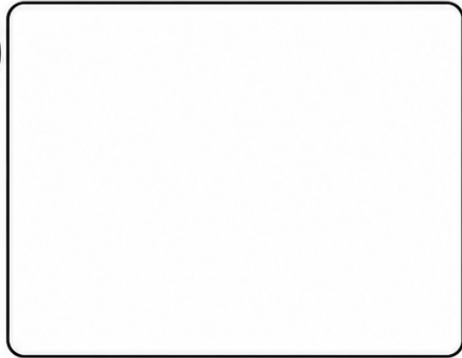
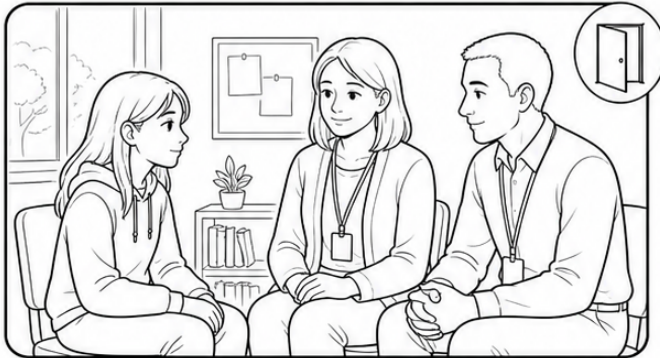
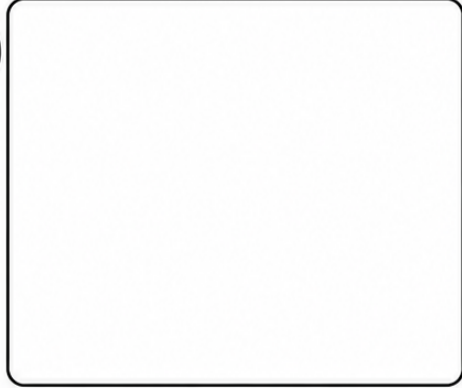


Mental wellbeing Activity Challenge Colouring Page

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Parent & Teacher Guidance

Curriculum focus

Topic: Mental wellbeing. Develop accurate observation, subject vocabulary and evidence-based explanation. Mapped scope: DfE statutory Relationships Education, RSE and Health Education guidance; use the version applicable on the teaching date, including revised guidance from 1 September 2026.

Before you begin

Review the picture together and ask the learner what they already notice about Mental wellbeing. Read the activity aloud, explain unfamiliar vocabulary, and agree which details need special attention.

Solo activity

The learner can complete the colouring independently, then use the finished page to explain three details linked to Mental wellbeing. Encourage accurate colour choices where they carry meaning, but allow creative choices elsewhere.

Group activity

Give pairs or small groups different areas to inspect. Ask them to agree on evidence before colouring, compare their findings, and present one curriculum fact to the class. Finish with a whole-group check against the guidance below.

Questions to guide discussion

What evidence can you see? Which feature is most important and why? How does one part connect to another? What new fact about Mental wellbeing can you explain using the picture?

Answers and checking

1 Notice sustained changes such as sleep, concentration or withdrawal. 2 Listen calmly without diagnosing or promising secrecy. 3 Encourage contact with a trusted adult or appropriate professional. 4 Maintain realistic routines, connection and follow-up. Urgent safety concerns should be passed promptly to a responsible adult or emergency service.
